NCSU Host Speaker - Dr. Jameco McKenzie, Director of Multicultural Student Affairs:

 Highlighted the importance of community as the foundation of leadership, emphasizing shared purpose & connection using Bolman & Deal's Four Frames: structural, human resource, political, & symbolic.

Visitor Presentation - Dr. Joy James, Appalachian State:

- Advocated for outdoor spaces to improve student well-being & academic success.
- Highlighted benefits of nature for stress reduction, cognitive function. & resilience.

Panel Discussion - Kirk Bradley:

- Discussed mental health resources, tuition affordability, campus infrastructure, & program classification issues.
